FREEWAY/ROAD CLOSURE UPDATE:

U.S. HIGHWAY 101 FULL CLOSURE IN MONTECITO UNTIL MONDAY AFTERNOON, JAN. 15Both directions of US 101 remain closed from the junction of State Route 126 in Ventura County to Milpas Street in Santa Barbara County due to mudslides, so motorists are advised to use the I-5 as an alternate route.

Caltrans reminds motorists to move over and slow down when driving through highway construction zones.

MONTECITO & SUMMERLAND BOIL YOUR WATER: DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST IF YOU LIVE IN MONTECITO OR SUMMERLAND

Bring all water to a boil, **let it boil for one (1) minute**, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking and food preparation **until further notice**. This is the preferred method to assure that the water is safe to drink.
